Praying and discussing the Scripture Readings for the FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

As we draw close to Holy Week, we hear Jesus talk about his approaching death. As Christians, we know that as difficult death is, our true focus and hope is in eternal life, trusting that our Lord is the source of eternal salvation. During this final week before Holy Week we keep in mind that just as our Lenten Journey will not end with Good Friday, but with Easter, so too does our own life's journey end not in death but in eternal life. Jeremiah looked forward to the day when God's covenant with humanity would be internalized in us, when it would be imprinted on our hearts. To prepare our hearts for keeping the covenant, we pray that God would create clean hearts in us. Especially during Lent, our longing for reconciliation and forgiveness can help to prepare our hearts. In the Gospel, Jesus speaks from the heart, questioning why he would ask God to save him from suffering and death when that was the purpose he came into the world, to redeem the world. Let God's Word penetrate our hearts as well as we come to the end of our Lenten journey.

atholic tradition calls this Fourth Sunday of Lent *Laetare*, that is, "*Rejoice*" Sunday, after the first Latin words of the ancient entrance antiphon which bids us all to be joyful and exult, especially those who have been mourning. Although sorrowing for our sins we respond to the Church's call to rejoice finding our joy in the Gospel's proclamation of God's love for the world. We see this love manifested in the gift of God's Son, who, by Word and Eucharistic Sacrifice, comes to bring us eternal life.

The preview of Easter joy that resonates through the Liturgy shines with special radiance as we read in John's Gospel the verse that is at the heart of the Christian message, John 3:16: "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life." we are loved unconditionally and everlastingly by God. St. Paul tells us we are "God's handiwork". The Old Testament covenant story bids us see all things, even historical disasters and human tragedies, as part of God's saving plan. We need to see the most unlikely people as instruments of God's will. Let us open our hearts to the joyfully transforming power of today's Scriptures.

Embracing gratitude as a form of prayer can profoundly deepen our spiritual journey. By taking time to specifically list things for which we

are grateful, we actively recognize and celebrate God's unwavering presence and blessings in our lives. This practice of gratitude not only fosters a deeper connection with the divine but also shifts our perspective, illuminating the myriad ways God's grace manifests daily. Creating a gratitude list on this day serves as a meaningful reflection during Lent, reminding us of the abundant love and mercy God extends to us, especially in times of preparation and renewal.




