QUESTION: WHY IS IT NOT A DAY OF OBLIGATION THIS YEAR?

ANSWER: FROM THE DECREE OF BISHOPS

On December 13, 1991 the members of the US National Conference of Bishops made the following general decree concerning Holy Days of Obligation for Latin Rite Catholics:

Whenever January 1st, August 15th or November 1st falls on a Saturday or on a Monday, the precept to attend Mass is abrogated. (There is no obligation for the faithful to attend Mass that day)

Gathered today as we are in God's presence, we bring our lives and our intentions to the altar as we offer God our thanks and praise. For we know that even in the midst of division and distress in the world, God will lift us up as Jeremiah was lifted up from the cistern in the first reading. The princes desired Jeremiah's death because his message demoralized them, it weakened the soldiers hands. But the prophet's word remained constant calling God's people back to fidelity to the covenant. Just when we think the princes have sealed Jeremiah's fate, a court attendant appears before the king and speaks for Jeremiah and he orders his rescue. This same fervor of mission is found in the preaching of Jesus who also found opposition to his message. The Letter to the Hebrews attests to this: *Consider how he endured such opposition from sinners, in order that you may not grow weary and lose heart.*" Jesus' characterization of his mission as "*coming to set the earth on fire*" reveals that he is engaged in purifying and refining. So necessary and urgent is this mission that he wishes the fire "*were already blazing*". Yet Jesus will not fully accomplish his work of refining until his Death and Resurrection. This is the meaning of his words: "*There is a baptism with which I must be baptized*". As Jesus preserved through his passion and cross and is now glorified, so we who are "*running the race*" "*while keeping our eyes fixed on Jesus*" will also triumph.



THE ASSUMPTION is our belief that Mary, the Mother of God, was taken to heaven, body and soul, after her earthly life. Because of Mary's central place in God's eternal plan of salvation, her body did not undergo corruption. Mary's Assumption offers us a glimpse of the promises made to us when we were baptized into Christ. We were given the promise that we too will enter heaven when Christ returns at the end of time.

The Blessed Virgin Mary, the first of the disciples, the one who brought the Son of God into the world, is honored today in this Feast of the Assumption. We believe that her bodily assumption into heaven is a sign to us of the future that awaits all who believe in her Son, Jesus. In Mary's Assumption we see the victory that God has in mind for all who believe in Jesus Christ. Each reading is a victory cry: in the Gospel Mary "*proclaims the greatness of the Lord*"; St. Paul announces that "*in Christ shall all be brought to life*"; and in Revelation the Son is glorified with the proclamation, "*Now have salvation and power come and the Kingdom of our God*".

Mary's joyful song of praise, her Magnificat, resounds throughout this great festival. Let us be attentive, as was Mary, to God's word of comfort, peace and challenge to all who long to see the face of God and pray to be as faithful a disciple as Mary



Reflection on the Liturgy of the Word



Whenever we hear the readings proclaimed at Mass, it is good to listen how the first reading gives us a focus for listening to the Gospel. Although it is the last reading, the Gospel is chosen first and in our season of Ordinary Time an Old Testament passage is chosen to compliment it, to show how what was foretold is fulfilled in Jesus. Today we hear Jesus speak about how our actions can exclude us from the heavenly banquet but he concludes with a sweeping statement of inclusion: "And people will come from the east and the west and from the north and the south and will recline at table in the kingdom of God." This echoes the line from our first reading "I know their works and their thoughts, and I come to gather nations of every language; they shall come and see my glory." So the question we should ask is, "Will I be saved?" The guest list, Jesus leaves no doubt, will hold some surprises: "For behold, some are last who will be first, and some are first who will be last." An old anonymous poem presents this Gospel truth in an unforgettable way: "I dreamt death came the other night, / And heaven's gate swung open wide. / with kindly grace an angel bright / Ushered me inside. / And there, to my astonishment / Stood folks I'd judged and labeled / As quite unfit, of little worth, and spiritually disabled. / Indignant words rose to my lips / But never were set free. / For every face showed stunned surprise— / No one expected me!"

La Asunción de la Virgen María

El 15 de agosto, los cristianos de todo el mundo celebran la Asunción de la Virgen María. Es una de las fiestas católicas más importantes, al igual que el Día de Todos los Santos, la Navidad y la Pascua. **Pero, ¿cuál es el origen de esta fiesta?**

Celebra la muerte, la resurrección, la entrada en el cielo y la coronación de la Virgen María que no había cometido ningún pecado. Según una tradición eclesiástica que se remonta al Concilio de Éfeso (431), al morir, la Virgen fue elevada inmediatamente al cielo.

Sin embargo, es importante distinguir entre la Asunción y la Ascensión, que celebra la subida de Jesucristo al cielo, y que se celebra cuarenta días después de la Pascua.

Se dice que la Virgen María, madre de Jesucristo, se instaló al final de su vida en Éfeso, en Asia Menor, acompañada del apóstol Juan. La casa en la que vivió (**la "Casa de la Virgen"**) sigue atrayendo a muchos peregrinos.

Esta Asunción (de una palabra latina que significa quitar o levantar) es una de las principales fiestas católicas dedicadas a la Virgen. *La Iglesia Ortodoxa también la celebra con fervor bajo el nombre de Dormición.*

La Asunción, que confirma el lugar especial de María en la humanidad, no se convirtió en dogma de la Iglesia católica hasta el 1 de noviembre de 1950, con la publicación por el Papa Pío XII de la Constitución Apostólica "Munificentissimus Deus", que dice: "La Inmaculada Madre de Dios, María siempre virgen, habiendo completado el curso de su vida terrenal, fue asunta (o elevada) en cuerpo y alma a la gloria celestial. Este documento, que tiene infalibilidad papal, es vinculante para la fe de los católicos.

En la celebración de la Asunción, no celebramos tanto la gloria de María como la gloria de Dios, que ha hecho maravillas con ella.

"La Santa Virgen nos acompaña en nuestro viaje... *Muchas veces en los últimos años la he presentado e invocado como la "Estrella de la Nueva Evangelización". La sigo presentando como una aurora luminosa y una guía segura para nuestro camino*" (Juan Pablo II - Al comienzo del nuevo milenio, n. 58).

En realidad, la Asunción es el fruto de la Resurrección. En María se realiza la victoria de Cristo sobre la muerte.

Al celebrar la Asunción de la Virgen María, la Iglesia honra a la humilde esclava del Señor, la mujer del silencio, la Virgen del Magnificat. Es la esperanza de que, si permanecemos sencillos y humildes, el Señor logrará grandes cosas en nosotros. Y es la certeza de que si permanecemos unidos a Cristo, como María, también participaremos de su gloria.

Desde la Asunción, María vela por todos los hombres y mujeres que el Padre quiere hacer sus hijos e hijas adoptivos.


