

PASTOR'S CORNER

Reflection on the Liturgy of the Word



This Sunday, as we celebrate Catechetical Sunday, with our focus on the Body of Christ given for us, the readings continue our focus on the least ones of the world and God's care for them. In our society's preoccupation with acquiring more and more material goods, our celebration today is a good reminder that we need to remember those who are being left behind, those Pope Francis calls the marginalized of society. In the words of the Prophet Amos: "*Woe to the complacent in Zion!*" speaking about the leaders of Israel and Judah who live in luxury while their people suffer the collapse of their respective kingdoms. Jesus echoes these words in the Gospel and condemns conspicuous consumption. He tells the familiar parable , the story of Lazarus and the rich man: *There was a rich man who dressed in purple garments and fine linen and dined sumptuously each day. And laying at his door was a poor man named Lazarus, covered with sores, who would gladly have eaten his fill of the scraps that fell from the rich man's table*" Jesus makes it clear that the greater sin of the rich man is that he doesn't even see Lazarus. We must strive as St. Paul says to "*pursue righteousness, devotion, faith, love patience and gentleness....to keep the commandments without stain or reproach.*" Let us take time to pray for the ability to see beyond the distractions of the things we possess to recognize our brothers and sisters in need.

Catechetical Sunday, the beginning of our Religious Education Year, is an opportunity for us to rededicate ourselves to this mission as a community of faith. Let us pray that we may be credible witnesses and effective proclaimers of the New Evangelization! It is a wonderful opportunity to reflect on the role that each of us plays, by virtue of our Baptism, in handing in the faith and being a witness to the Gospel.

CATECHETICAL SUNDAY AND THE BEGINNING OF RELIGIOUS EDUCATION



This year our Parish will celebrate Catechetical Sunday on September 25th. It is the beginning of our Religious Education Year. The 2022/23 theme is
"THIS IS MY BODY GIVEN FOR YOU"

The Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life. The term "Eucharist" originates from the Greek word eucharistia, meaning thanksgiving. In the celebration of the Eucharist, bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit and the instrumentality of the priest. The whole Christ is truly present -- body, blood, soul, and divinity -- under the appearances of bread and wine, the glorified Christ who rose from the dead. This is what the Church means when she speaks of the "Real Presence" of Christ in the Eucharist.

Those who the Community has designated to serve as catechists will be called forth to be commissioned, tis Sunday at the 11:00 Mass. for their ministry. Catechetical Sunday is a wonderful opportunity to reflect on the role that each person plays, by virtue of Baptism, in handing on the faith and being a witness to the Gospel. Catechetical Sunday is an opportunity for all to rededicate themselves to this mission as a community of faith. Our Religious Education classes will begin this Wednesday, September 28th. Registration for all classes has begun and all children should be registered before the 28th.

I am pleased to grant you permission to retire formally from active deacon ministry. Even in retirement the Deacon, as a cleric of the church, retains a special bond with his parish in ministry. A retired Deacon retains his faculties, and with the approval of the pastor, may continue to perform specific ministries which are appropriate to the Office of Deacon".

The Parish extends our congratulations for the 24 years Deacon Phil has served as a Deacon here and we look forward to the many more years he will serve, especially his 25th Anniversary of Ordination to the Diaconate in May of 2023. (Do I hear a party!?)

THE BLESSING OF ANIMALS

This custom is celebrated in remembrance of St. Francis of Assisi's love for all God's creatures. Francis, whose feast day is October 4th, loved the larks flying about his hill-top town. He and his early brothers, staying in a small hovel, allowed themselves to be displaced by a donkey. Francis wrote a Canticle of the Creatures, an ode to God's living things. *"All praise to you, O Lord, for all these brother and sister creatures."* And there was testimony in the cause for St. Clare of Assisi's canonization that referred to her little cat! The bond between person and pet is like no other relationship, because the communication between fellow creatures is at its most basic. Eye-to-eye, a man and his dog, or a woman and her cat, are two creatures of love. No wonder people enjoy the opportunity to take their animal companions to church for a special blessing. Church is the place where the bond of creation is celebrated.


Faith Formation Registration


