




PASTOR'S CORNER

Reflection on the Liturgy of the Word



Mark's Gospel presents Jesus' life as the perfect pattern for disciples to follow. He presents a day in the life of Jesus, the intense pastoral activity of Jesus; preaching, teaching, casting out demons and healing. Then, after an evening of ministering to the whole town we are told: *"Rising very early before dawn, he left and went off to a deserted place, where he prayed"* then Jesus returns to even more preaching and service. As Jesus comes to us in this Eucharist as the Bread of Life, we open our hearts to the healing he imparts, that we might devote ourselves to the loving service he commands. We are nourished by Jesus as we continue our journey to the Kingdom and we give praise and thanks to God for this opportunity as we renew our trust in the Lord.

What a stark contrast the Scriptures present. In the first reading Job's waking hours are a pointless drudgery, his restless nights an endless wrestling with anxiety. But in the Gospel, Jesus' life is a rich tapestry of contemplative prayer and compassionate service. Sometimes, we too need time in prayer, reflection and silence to find holiness and wholeness in our lives, to reorder priorities and recapture balance, to deepen our relationship with God so we can be strengthened to be, as St. Paul says, "*all things to all*" in compassionate service.

BURYING THE ALLELUIA



Next Sunday at the 11:00 Mass we will have an ALLELUIA PROCESSION before the Gospel to place your Alleluia signs and posters in a box that will be closed until Easter. We do not sing or say Alleluia during Lent. As this will be the last Sunday before Lent begins we will bury the Alleluia. To participate in this procession write the word ALLELUIA on construction paper, cardboard or any type of paper and decorate it. When we begin singing the Alleluia we will walk around the Church to the Sanctuary and place the Alleluia in the box

N ext Wednesday is Ash Wednesday and we begin our annual observance of Lent, the special season for the ascent to the holy mountain of Easter. Through its two-fold themes of repentance and baptism, Lent disposes us to celebrate the paschal mystery. By listening more intently to the Word of God and devoting ourselves to prayer we are prepared through a spirit of repentance to renew our baptismal promises.

REGULATIONS FOR LENT

Abstinence: All of the faithful who have reached the age of 14 years are required to Abstain totally from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, All of the Fridays of Lent and Good Friday.

Fasting: All of the faithful who are between the ages of 18 and 59 inclusive are required to Fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This practice involves limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Light sustenance may also be taken on two other occasions during the day. The Church also requests that pastors and parents see to it that young persons, who are not bound to follow the above requirements, are educated in an authentic sense of penance.

Easter Duty: After they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, all the faithful are bound by the obligation to receive Holy Communion at least once a year. This precept must be fulfilled during the Easter season. By special indult in the Dioceses in the United States, the time period for fulfilling this obligation has been extended to include the period from Ash Wednesday, February 14th to Pentecost Sunday, May 19th.

THE FOLLOWING SHOULD ALSO BE NOTED:

By Divine Law, all the faithful are required to do penance. In view of this, the obligation to observe, as a whole or "substantially" the penitential days specified by the Church, is a serious one. All other Fridays of the year remain as days of penance in prayerful remembrance of the Passion of Our Lord, Jesus Christ. While abstinence, in a true spirit of penance, is commended, the Bishops of the U.S. have indicated that each individual may substitute for that tradition some other practice of voluntary self-denial or personal penance. This may involve acts of prayer or charity.
