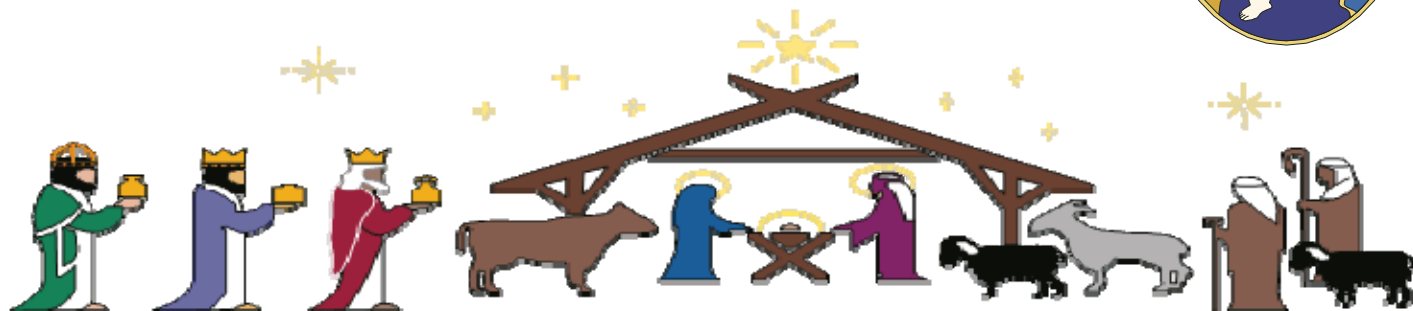

## Reflection on the Liturgy of the Word for CHRISTMAS



*“A light will shine on us this day; the Lord is born for us”*

**G**od's Word proclaims for us, on this Sacred Feast, “the radiant splendor of this holy night/day”. Ours is the abundant joy Isaiah proclaims: “for a people in darkness have seen a great light” whatever burdens we bear are lightened by the birth of the Prince of Peace. In Christ, St. Paul proclaims: “the grace has appeared”, teaching us how to live just and holy lives in this world, over whose too-often warring peoples the choirs of heavenly angels sing “Glory to God and Peace on Earth”, the enduring gifts of the Child born of the Virgin Mary. We open our hearts to the Christmas message of reconciliation, healing and salvation.

*“O COME, LET US ADORE HIM, CHRIST THE LORD!”*

We celebrate the mystery of the Incarnation when God became human in Jesus and we on Earth see the face of God. No wonder the angels announce the good news! Our great and mighty God comes to us in a humble stable, not an opulent palace. No wonder the shepherds rejoiced! Let us all join in marveling at how much God loves us and praise God for the wonderful gift of such love. 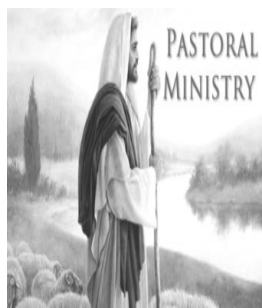

### CHRISTMAS MESSAGE: DEAR PARISHIONERS OF OUR LADY OF GRACE,
