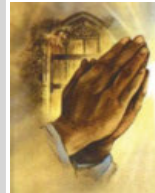

The bright star in the sky drew the Magi from their distant kingdom to see the newborn King and offer him treasures. We are drawn here today by our King, Christ the Lord, and we offer our treasures—our hearts, our hopes, our lives. “Behold, the Lord, the Mighty One, has come” in the Holy Child born of the Blessed Virgin Mary. revealed to the shepherds on Christmas as Israel’s long awaited Messiah and today as the universal Savior, inviting all nations of the world, represented by the Magi who followed the star by which God “gathered his children from the rising to the setting of the sun”. With them, we draw near to offer Jesus the gold of our adoration, the incense of our prayer and the myrrh of our hearts devoted love. Isaiah’s vision of the far-off nations streaming toward Jerusalem to worship the one true God is fulfilled, says St. Paul, in Christ Jesus. By his saving Gospel all people have been made coheirs of

In honor of Annette Bonvino and in thanksgiving for all she did for our Parish, remembering her untimely death, I would like to reprint from last year what would be her Christmas Thank You from the Pastoral Ministry Program.

- Our Ministry is alive and continues to help our community because of the dedication of our volunteers and their commitment. We, also, cannot overlook our parishioners and their monetary donations.
- Our Ministry to the Homeless continues to shop, prepare and deliver a full hot meal on Wednesdays and a light brunch on Friday mornings. They also prepare a special meal on the Wednesdays prior to Easter, Thanksgiving and Christmas.
- Our Food Pantry is open 3 mornings per week, Monday, Wednesday and Thursday from 9:00-11:30. it is staffed with volunteers who stack shelves and prepare bags of food depending on the size of the family. No one is turned away regardless of their background. This was Sr. Jane’s commitment which is followed today.
- Our Lady of Grace Catholic Academy and Faith Formation Program staff and students run an Easter, Thanksgiving and Christmas Food Drive. The food collected is used for the Food Pantry and Homeless Ministry. They also run a toy drive. Toys are distributed to our Food Pantry Families and the Women’s Safe Start Program. These toys are greatly appreciated by the families who will have toys for their children.
- Our Thrift Shop had a complete make-over thanks to Mary Ann DeLuca and Phyllis Niwinski. They along with their volunteer help open the shop on Sunday mornings and are a welcome site. Visit when you can!

The term “*epiphany*” means “to show” or “to make known” or even “to reveal”. It remembers the coming of the wise men bringing gifts to visit the Christ child, who by so doing “reveal” Jesus to the world as Lord and King

BLESSING OF HOMES ON THE FEAST OF THE EPIPHANY

Using the symbol +C+B+M+ with two numbers before and two numbers after (20+C+B+M+24) is written in chalk above the doorway of Christian homes. The letters are the initials of the traditional names of the Three Magi: Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar. These letters also abbreviate the Latin phrase *Christus mansionem benedicat*, “May Christ bless the house”. The beginning and ending numbers consecrate the new year. The crosses represent Christ. The chalk is an Incarnational image because it reminds us of the dust of the earth from which we were made.

Leader: Peace be with this house and with all who live here.

Response (All): And peace be with all who enter here.

Leader: During these days of the Christmas Season, we keep this Feast of Epiphany, celebrating the manifestation of Christ to the Magi, and thereby to the whole world. Today, Christ is manifest to us! Today this home is a holy place because of the presence of Christ here.

Leader: Listen to the Gospel according to Matthew (2:1-12)

When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of King Herod, behold, magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem, saying, “Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage.” When King Herod heard this, he was greatly troubled, and all Jerusalem with him.

Assembling all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, He inquired of them where the Christ was to be born. They said to him, “In Bethlehem of Judea, for thus it has been written through the prophet: *And you,*

Bethlehem, land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; since from you shall come a ruler, who is to shepherd my people Israel.” Then Herod called the magi secretly and ascertained from them the time of the star’s appearance. He sent them to Bethlehem and said, “Go and search diligently for the child. When you have found him, bring me word, that I too may go and do him homage.” After their audience with the king they set out. And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was. They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed for their country by another way.

Leader: The Word of the Lord.

Response (All): Thanks be to God!

Leader: O God, Lord of all that exists, you revealed your only-begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who inhabit it. Fill each of us with the Light of Christ, that our concern for others may reflect your love. We ask this through Christ our Lord. AMEN

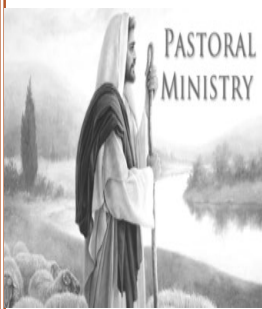

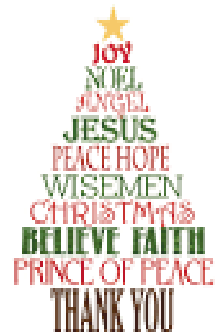

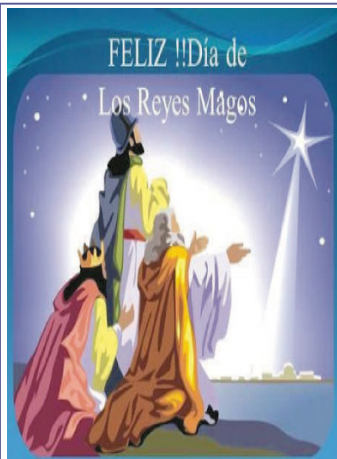

La Epifanía del Señor el 7 de enero de 2024

"Este misterio consiste en que todas las naciones están asociadas a la misma herencia, al mismo cuerpo, a la participación de la misma promesa, en Cristo Jesús, mediante el anuncio del Evangelio. (Ef 3:6)

En Epifanía, los Magos nos introducen en la dimensión universal de la salvación: Ciertamente, Dios ha venido por mí, pero también ha venido por todos. Así, la Buena Nueva de la Encarnación se anuncia a todas las naciones. Todas las personas están invitadas a conocer la luz que trae Cristo, personas de todas las razas, pueblos y naciones. Este es el mensaje que San Mateo quiere transmitirnos en el Evangelio de hoy. La puerta de la fe cristiana está abierta de par en par para todos, pero para llegar a Dios, para alcanzar la salvación, hay que dejarse guiar y estar dispuesto a hacer algún esfuerzo. En primer lugar, fue la estrella que condujo a los Magos al pesebre, una estrella que siguieron durante muchos días desde sus lejanas tierras.

Por muy hermosa y querida que sea la Estrella de Belén para nuestros corazones, su misión termina una vez que se encuentra al niño en la cuna: es realmente a Jesús a quien estaba destinada a revelar. Es Él, ahora la Luz, la Verdad, lo que buscaban los Magos, Él es la Salvación por la que habían aceptado esforzarse tanto. Al llegar hasta este recién nacido, los Magos doblaron sus rodillas y le entregaron humildemente sus regalos: oro ofrecido a los reyes, incienso ofrecido a Dios y mirra ofrecida a un mortal. Así, en este niño reconocen a su rey, a su Dios al que adoran y a su hermano en humanidad al que saludan.

Guiados por la estrella de Belén, los Magos vieron y creyeron. Este encuentro dará un vuelco a sus vidas, porque después de ver a su Salvador, los Reyes Magos regresan por otra ruta. Mateo probablemente quiere decir que el encuentro con la Luz verdadera debe cambiar algo en nuestras vidas, nos hace tomar otro camino. Por último, la alegría y la felicidad de haber encontrado y encontrado a Dios no pueden guardarse egoístamente para nosotros mismos, para nuestra pequeña capilla. Jesús vino a ofrecer la salvación a todos los hombres y mujeres de todas las razas y condiciones. Por eso nos corresponde a nosotros compartir con los demás la alegría y la paz que nos da el encuentro con Dios.



La fiesta del Bautismo de Jesús, el 8 de enero de 2024

Con la fiesta del Bautismo de Jesús, que celebramos este lunes 8 de enero de 2024, concluye el tiempo litúrgico de Navidad. Al Niño que los Magos habían venido a adorar desde Oriente, en Belén, ofreciendo sus dones simbólicos, lo encontramos ahora adulto, en el momento en que es bautizado en el río Jordán por el gran profeta Juan (Mt.3,13).

El evangelio señala que cuando Jesús salió del agua después de recibir el bautismo, los cielos se abrieron y el Espíritu Santo descendió sobre Él como una paloma (Mt. 3, 16). Entonces se oyó una voz del cielo que decía: *"Este es mi Hijo amado, en él tengo complacencia"* (Mt. 3, 17). Esta fue Su primera manifestación pública después de unos treinta años de vida oculta en Nazaret.

Además de Juan el Bautista, sus discípulos también fueron testigos oculares de este singular acontecimiento. Algunos de ellos empezaron a seguirle (Jn. 1,35-40). Al mismo tiempo fue una cristofanía y una teofanía: en primer lugar Jesús se

manifestó como el Cristo, palabra griega que traduce la palabra hebrea Mesías, que significa "ungido": no fue ungido con aceite como los reyes y sumos sacerdotes de Israel, sino con el Espíritu Santo, porque al mismo tiempo aparecieron junto al Hijo de Dios los signos del Espíritu Santo y del Padre celestial.

Pero, ¿cuál es el sentido de este acto que Jesús quiso realizar, venciendo la resistencia del Bautista, para obedecer la voluntad del Padre (Mt. 3, 14-15)? Su significado profundo sólo aparecerá al final de la existencia terrenal de Cristo, es decir, en su muerte y resurrección. Al ser bautizado por Juan junto con los pecadores, Jesús comenzó a tomar sobre sí la culpa de toda la humanidad, como Cordero de Dios que quita el pecado del mundo (Jn 1,29), obra que cumplió plenamente en la cruz, cuando también recibió su bautismo (Lc 12,50). En efecto, al morir se sumergió en el amor del Padre y derramó el Espíritu Santo, para que los que creen en Él puedan renacer de esta fuente inagotable de vida nueva y eterna.

Toda la misión de Cristo se resume así: bautizarnos en el Espíritu Santo, liberarnos de la esclavitud de la muerte y abrirnos el cielo, es decir, el acceso a la vida verdadera y plena, que será "una inmersión siempre nueva en la inmensidad del ser, mientras estamos sencillamente llenos de alegría" (Spe salvi, 12).
