

PRAY FOR THE DECEASED

Reflection on the Liturgy of the Word



FOURTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading - <u>Ezekiel 2:2-5</u>: God empowers Ezekiel to speak to rebellious Israel, ensuring that whether or not they listen, they will recognize the presence of a prophet among them.

Responsorial Psalm - <u>Psalm 123</u>: We continually look to the Lord for mercy, enduring scorn and arrogance from others, just as servants watch their masters, waiting for compassion.

Second Reading - <u>2 Corinthians 12:7-10</u>: Paul embraces his weaknesses and hardships, seeing them as opportunities for Christ's power to shine, affirming that divine strength is perfected in human weakness.

Gospel - <u>Mark 6:1-6</u>: Jesus visits Nazareth, where he teaches in the synagogue, but the people reject him, commenting on his lack of status as a local carpenter's son. Jesus is amazed by their lack of faith, and he is only able to heal a few sick people because of their unbelief.

On this Lord's day we ponder God's love right here in our holy place of worship. In the readings God warns the prophet Ezekiel that the people to whom God is sending him are stubborn of heart. In Jesus' hometown synagogue he is "amazed at their lack of faith". "So he was not able to perform any mighty deed there, apart from curing a few sick people by laying his hands on them." God challenges us to come to this Eucharist as people of faith if we want to see Jesus' power at work here in the midst of our community and in our daily lives.

In last week's Gospel, two people Jesus had never met came in faith and so received the healing they sought. Today we hear how Jesus' own people lack faith, so he is unable to perform mighty deeds. But even our weaknesses St. Paul says must not diminish our faith or discourage us from trusting that God's grace will see us through. Paul is centered in Christ: "I will rather boast most gladly of my weaknesses, in order that the power of Christ may dwell with me." "...for when I am weak, then I am strong."



FIFTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading - <u>Amos 7:12-15</u>: Amaziah orders Amos to leave Bethel and prophesy elsewhere. Amos responds he was called by God from his life as a shepherd to prophesy to Israel.

Responsorial Psalm - <u>Psalm 85</u>: I pray to hear God's promises of peace and witness his glory in our land. His salvation is near, and he blesses us with abundant harvests and righteousness.

Second Reading - Ephesians 1:3-14 or 1:3-10: We are blessed in Christ with spiritual riches, chosen to be holy, redeemed by his sacrifice, and sealed with the Holy Spirit, fulfilling God's plan for unity and glory.


Gospel - <u>Mark 6:7-13</u>: Jesus empowered the Twelve, sending them with minimal provisions to preach repentance, expel demons, and heal the sick. They were to stay in welcoming homes and leave unwelcoming places.


We have been called together as God's holy people to hear the Word of God and to share Jesus' Eucharistic Sacrifice, the Supper of the Lamb. We open our heart to the God who loves us. But the God who calls us together to this Liturgy will also send us forth from here to spread the Gospel message and to praise the Lord by our lives. May our worship today, then, both confirm us in faith and prepare us for mission. In the Gospel Jesus instructs his disciples before sending them out on mission. To prepare us for this experience we first hear from the Prophet Amos, in the first reading, who defends his own mission as God's prophet. Amos' self-defense, together with Jesus' instructions, should remind us that, by virtue of our Baptism & Confirmation, we too are sent out into the world to bear witness. The message we are to share with others, says St. Paul is forgiveness of sins through Christ's Blood and through adoption into God's family, a share in God's grace here and God's glory hereafter.

The American Flag Flown In Honor of Our VETERANS & FIRST RESPONDERS



ur Lady of Mount Carmel the title given to the Blessed Mother in her role as Patroness of the Carmelite Order. The Feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel known as the 'Scapular Feast," is associated with the Brown Scapular. A devotional sacramental signifying the wearer's consecration to Mary and affiliation with the Carmelite Order. The first Carmelites were Christian hermits living on Mount Carmel in the Holy Land during the late 12th and early to mid 13th centuries. They built a chapel in the midst of their hermitage, which they dedicated to the Blessed Virgin. Since the 15th century, popular devotion to Our Lady of Mount Carmel has centered on the Brown Scapular, a sacramental associated with promises of Mary's special aid for the salvation of the devoted wearer. Traditionally, Mary is said to have given the Scapular to St. Simon Stock, an early prior general of the Order, who had a vision of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

The Scapular forms part of the Carmelite habit, promising that those who died wearing it would be saved. According to the Vatican's Congregation for Divine Worship, the Brown Scapular is "an external sign of the filial relationship established between the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother and Queen of Mount Carmel and the faithful who entrust themselves totally to her protection, who have recourse to her maternal intercession, who are mindful of the primacy of the spiritual life and the need for prayer.

SUMMER MISSION APPEAL WEEKEND OF JULY 13/14



_Fr. James Channan, O.P., will preach a mission appeal on behalf of the Dominican Fathers of Ibn-e-Mariam ("Son of Mary") in Pakistan at all Masses on July 13-14.. The first known Dominican arrived in the Indian sub-continent in 1291, just 70 years after the death of St. Dominic. By the 17th century the Dominican Congregation of India, based in the Portuguese settlement at Goa, numbered about 350 brothers. The 20th century saw a revival of Dominican presence in both India and in what is now Pakistan.

Fr. James will share the good works of the Friars in Pakistan, where the Dominicans open schools to all boys and girls, and evangelize as itinerant preachers, serve in Parish ministries, teach in schools, colleges, and universities. The young men called to enter the Priesthood as Dominican Fathers in Pakistan depend on the prayers and support of the faithful here in the United States.
