

EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading *Exodus 16:2–4, 12–15*

The Lord feeds the Israelites with manna.

Responsorial Psalm *Psalm* 78:3–4, 23–24, 25, 54

A song of praise to God for his deeds to Israel.

Second Reading *Ephesians 4:17, 20–24*

Christians become a new creation in Christ.


Gospel Reading John 6:24–35

Jesus teaches the crowds that he is the "Bread of Life."

Like the Israelites gathered in sacred assembly and like the crowds in the Gospel who came looking for Jesus, we too gather before the Lord in this sacred assembly. We are not here to grumble against the Lord for lack of food or to demand a sign from Jesus. Instead we assemble grateful for God's living Word and for the true Bread of Heaven, Jesus the Bread of Life.

We continue reading in John's Gospel, chapter 6, as Jesus today helps us understand that God's gift of manna to the Israelites in the desert in the first reading, was a sign pointing to Jesus. St. Paul reminds us that as a Eucharistic people we must "put away" our old, sinful selves and "put on the new self" created by God for holiness.

Jesus said: Amen, Amen, I say to you, it was not Moses who gave the bread from heaven; my Father gives you the true bread from heaven. For the bread of God is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world." Jesus said to them: I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst."

NINETEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading 1 Kings 19:4-8

The Lord feeds Elijah, strengthening him for his journey to Horeb.

A prayer of praise to God for his goodness

Second Reading *Ephesians 4:30—5:2*

The Ephesians are encouraged to be imitators of Christ.

Gospel Reading John 6:41-51

Jesus responds to the murmurs of the crowd, who wonder what he means when he says that he came down from heaven.

The Opening Prayer (Collect) celebrates God's gift of "the Spirit of adoption" that has made us God's "sons and daughters" destined for the "promised inheritance" of eternal life. Jesus declares that "no one can come to him unless drawn by the Father". Therefore, with true sorrow for our sins, but even greater trust in God's goodness, we worship the loving God whose gifts to us, in Jesus, are boundless.

The Prophet Elijah found strength for his long, dangerous journey in the food God sent him, so we, on our life-long journey to God's Kingdom find strength in "the living bread from heaven", Jesus' "flesh for the life of the world". St. Paul reminds us that sharing Christ's sacrificial gift together requires us to be as compassionate and forgiving toward one another as God, in Christ, is to us.

Assumption. We believe that her bodily assumption into heaven is a sign to us of the future that awaits all who believe in her Son, Jesus. We remember Mary at the end of her earthly life, forever unstained by sin, was brought body and soul to heaven. Since it was through her that God's Son was born and since her Son brought redemption to the whole world, we can assume that our Blessed Mother was taken summarily to heaven to be reunited with her beloved Son. Today we celebrate Mary, the Holy Mother of God, who provides a model of obedience and humility, who intercedes for us as the Queen of Heaven and who stands ready to welcome us to life eternal in the presence of her Son.

In Mary's Assumption we see the victory that God has in mind for all who believe in Jesus Christ. Each reading is a victory cry: in the Gospel Mary "proclaims the greatness of the Lord"; St. Paul announces that "in Christ shall all be brought to life"; and in Revelation the Son is glorified with the proclamation,

"Now have salvation and power come and the Kingdom of our God". Mary's joyful song of praise, her Magnificat, resounds throughout this great festival. Let us be attentive, as was Mary, to God's word of comfort, peace and challenge to all who long to see the face of God and pray to be as faithful a disciple as Mary.

La Asunción de la Virgen María

El 15 de agosto, los cristianos de todo el mundo celebran la Asunción de la Virgen María. Es una de las fiestas católicas más importantes, al igual que el Día de Todos los Santos, la Navidad y la Pascua. **Pero, ¿cuál es el origen de esta fiesta?**

Celebra la muerte, la resurrección, la entrada en el cielo y la coronación de la Virgen María que no había cometido ningún pecado. Según una tradición eclesiástica que se remonta al Concilio de Éfeso (431), al morir, la Virgen fue elevada inmediatamente al cielo.

Sin embargo, es importante distinguir entre la Asunción y la Ascension, que celebra la súbida de Jesucristo al cielo, y que se celebra cuarenta días después de la Pascua.

Se dice que la Virgen María, madre de Jesucristo, se instaló al final de su vida en Éfeso, en Asia Menor, acompañada del apóstol Juan. La casa en la que vivió (la "Casa de la Virgen") sigue atrayendo a muchos peregrinos.

Esta Asunción (de una palabra latina que significa quitar o levantar) es una de las principales fiestas católicas dedicadas a la Virgen. *La Iglesia Ortodoxa también la celebra con fervor bajo el nombre de Dormición*.

La Asunción, que confirma el lugar especial de María en la humanidad, no se convirtió en dogma de la Iglesia católica hasta el 1 de noviembre de 1950, con la publicación por el Papa Pío XII de la Constitución Apostólica "Munificentissimus Deus", que dice: "La Inmaculada Madre de Dios, María siempre virgen, habiendo completado el curso de su vida terrenal, fue asunta (o elevada) en cuerpo y alma a la gloria celestial. Este documento, que tiene infalibilidad papal, es vinculante para la fe de los católicos. En la celebración de la Asunción, no celebramos tanto la gloria de María como la gloria de Dios, que ha hecho maravillas con ella.

"La Santa Virgen nos acompaña en nuestro viaje... Muchas veces en los últimos años la he presentado e invocado como la "Estrella de la Nueva Evangelización". La sigo presentando como una aurora luminosa y una guía segura para nuestro camino" (Juan Pablo II - Al comienzo del nuevo milenio, n. 58).

En realidad, la Asunción es el fruto de la Resurrección. En María se realiza la victoria de Cristo sobre la muerte. Al celebrar la Asunción de la Virgen María, la Iglesia honra a la humilde esclava del Señor, la mujer del silencio, la

Virgen del Magnificat. Es la esperanza de que, si permanecemos sencillos y humildes, el Señor logrará grandes cosas en nosotros. Y es la certeza de que si permanecemos unidos a Cristo, como María, también participaremos de su gloria. Desde la Asunción, María vela por todos los hombres y mujeres que el Padre quiere hacer sus hijos e hijas adoptivos.
