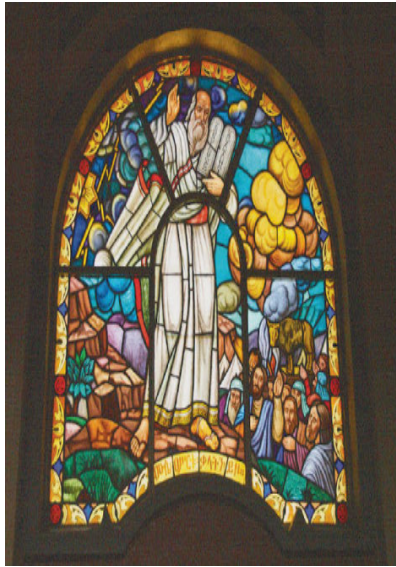

TWENTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading *Deuteronomy 4:1-2,6-8*

Moses tells the Israelites to observe the commandments that God gave them.

Responsorial Psalm *Psalms 15:2-3,3-4,4-5*

Those who do justice will find favor with God.

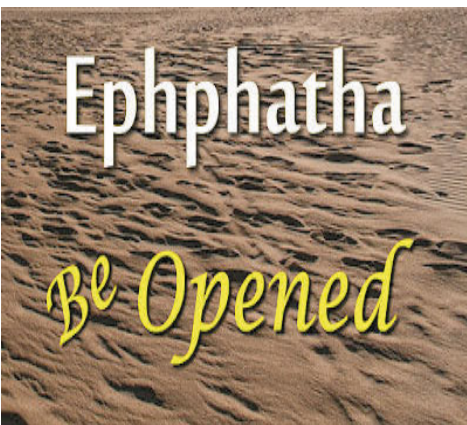
Second Reading *James 1:17-18,21b-22,27*

James teaches that Christians should be doers of the Word.

Gospel Reading *Mark 7:1-8,14-15,21-23*

Jesus teaches that it is that which comes from our hearts that defiles us.

On this Labor Day weekend and our World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation we gather to remember all those whose labor makes possible our enjoyment of earth's bounty and life's many blessings and to offer praise and thanks to God to help us lead lives that respond to God's call to be stewards of his creation. All the readings challenge us to a living faith, that is, a faith that is authentic because it leads to selflessness. They teach that religion is live-giving only if it prompts us to more fervent love of God translated into practical love of our neighbor. Deuteronomy portrays Israel as a nation that was acclaimed as "just" because the people obeyed God's law. As it promises in our Responsorial Psalm, that "the one who does justice will live in the presence of the Lord". As we come into God's presence let us renew our resolve to become a more just and faithful people, a people holy to the Lord whose faith is authentic, living and true. Moses exhorts Israel to observe God's commandments "carefully, not adding or subtracting from them". James warns the first Christians to be "doers of the Word, not hearers only", by caring for society's most vulnerable. Jesus challenges us to avoid all hypocrisy, making sure that our outward religious observance is matched by our inner purity of heart and our love for God is not negated by harsh judgments towards others.

James teaches there is to be no partiality within the Christian community.

Gospel Reading *Mark 7:31-37*

Jesus restores a man's hearing and speech.

We gather together this Lord's Day people who come from different families and vocations, varied educational and economic backgrounds and different nationalities and ethnic groups. Yet we form one assembly of God's holy people, baptized into the one Lord, who opens our ears to hear God's Word and our lips to sing God's praise as one united family. As St. James exhorts us in today's second reading: "show no partiality as you adhere to the faith in our glorious Lord Jesus Christ", let us take special care to extend the warmth of our community's welcoming hospitality to anyone we may not recognize as part of our worshipping family.

As always in Ordinary Time, the Old Testament reading prepares us to hear the Gospel. Isaiah's prophetic vision of God coming to heal the people becomes a reality that Jesus fulfills by healing a man who is deaf and afflicted with a speech impediment. "Ephphatha!—that is, Be opened!" This healing ministry of Jesus must continue through us, his disciples, as we extend the warm, hospitable welcome of Christ-like caring and concern to all. "Did not God choose those who are poor in the world to be rich in faith and heirs to the kingdom that he promised to those who love him?"

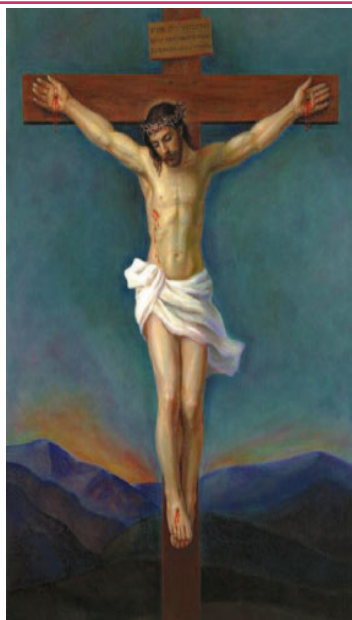

THE STORY OF THE EXULTATION OF THE HOLY CROSS

Early in the fourth century, Saint Helena, mother of the Roman Emperor Constantine, went to Jerusalem in search of the holy places of Christ's life. She razed the second-century Temple of Aphrodite, which tradition held was built over the Savior's tomb, and her son built the Basilica of the Holy Sepulcher on that spot. During the excavation, workers found three crosses. Legend has it that the one on which Jesus died was identified when its touch healed a dying woman. The cross immediately became an object of veneration. At a Good Friday celebration in Jerusalem toward the end of the fourth century, according to an eyewitness, the wood was taken out of its silver container and placed on a table together with the inscription Pilate ordered placed above Jesus' head: Then "all the people pass through one by one; all of them bow down, touching the cross and the inscription, first with their foreheads, then with their eyes; and, after kissing the cross, they move on." To this day, the Eastern Churches, Catholic and Orthodox alike, celebrate the Exaltation of the Holy Cross on the September anniversary of the basilica's dedication. The feast entered the Western calendar in the seventh century after Emperor Heraclius recovered the cross from the Persians, who had carried it off in 614, 15 years earlier. According to the story, the emperor intended to carry the cross back into Jerusalem himself, but was unable to move forward until he took off his imperial garb and became a barefoot pilgrim. The cross is today the universal image of Christian belief. Countless generations of artists have turned it into a thing of beauty to be carried in procession or worn as jewelry. To the eyes of the first Christians, it had no beauty. It stood outside too many city walls, decorated only with decaying corpses, as a threat to anyone who defied Rome's authority—including Christians who refused sacrifice to Roman gods. Although believers spoke of the cross as the instrument of salvation, it seldom appeared in Christian art unless disguised as an anchor or the Chi-Rho until after Constantine's edict of toleration. This day is also called the Exaltation of the Cross, Elevation of the Cross, Holy Cross Day, Holy Rood Day, or Roodmas. The Liturgy of the Cross is a triumphant Liturgy. When Moses lifted up the bronze serpent over the people, it was a foreshadowing of the salvation through Jesus when He was lifted up on the Cross. Our Mother Church sings of the triumph of the Cross, the instrument of our redemption. To follow Christ we must take up His cross, follow Him and become obedient until death, even if it means death on the cross. We identify with Christ on the Cross and become co-redeemers, sharing in His cross. We made the Sign of the Cross before prayer which helps to fix our minds and hearts to God. After prayer we make the Sign of the Cross to keep close to God. During trials and temptations our strength and protection is the Sign of the Cross. At Baptism we are sealed with the Sign of the Cross, signifying the fullness of redemption and that we belong to Christ. Let us look to the cross frequently and realize that when we make the Sign of the Cross we give our entire self to God, mind, soul, heart, body, will, thoughts.

*O cross, you are the glorious sign of victory.
Through your power may we share in the triumph of Christ Jesus. Amen.*
