

Reflection on the Liturgy of the Word





SIXTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading Jeremiah 23:1-6

The Lord promises to shepherd his people Israel.

Responsorial Psalm Psalm 23:1-3,3-4,5,6

The Lord is our shepherd.

Second Reading *Ephesians 2:13-18*

Christ has reconciled us with God and united us in peace.

Gospel Reading Mark 6:30-34

Jesus invites his disciples to rest after their ministry, and Jesus is moved with pity for the crowds who pursue them.

Even with the multiple responsibilities and preoccupations of our daily lives, we are gathered in the name of our Lord Jesus. The Gospel invites us to come away and rest awhile. As we come to this holy place, we look for God's Word to strengthen us and the Living Bread to refresh us. We open our heart to Jesus the Good Shepherd, whose own heart was moved with pity for all who are in need. Our prayer is for our world, created by God, redeemed by Christ and sanctified by the Holy Spirit.

How easy it is to identify with Jesus and his disciples, like so many of us, especially in summertime, they were looking forward to time away from lives so busy they had no time even to eat. But unlike the self-centered shepherds God condemns in the first reading, Jesus is a compassionate Shepherd. As St. Paul says, Christ is our *peace* and *reconciliation*. Though the Gospel tells us that Jesus taught the vast crowd "many things" that day, perhaps the most important lesson is the one he taught his disciples not in words but in deeds, by giving up his time away and showing compassion for those in need.



SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading 2 Kings 4:42-44

Elisha the prophet feeds 100 people with 20 barley loaves.

Responsorial Psalm *Psalm 145:10-11,15-16,17-18*

The Lord feeds his people and answers their needs.

Second Reading *Ephesians 4:1-6*

The Ephesians are encouraged to live the unity of their Baptism.

Gospel Reading John 6:1-15

Jesus feeds the crowd of more than five thousand people with five barley loaves and two fish.

Called together in one hope and sharing one Lord, one faith, one baptism, we come to worship in the Holy Spirit who forms us as one body, one spirit in Christ. We humbly pray to Jesus, the *Bread of Life*, who gives his flesh for the life of the world, for the grace to live a life worthy of our Christian calling. We prepare to hear the 6th chapter of St. John's Gospel, the Bread of Life Discourse, by listening to the experience of the Prophet Elisha who feeds one hundred people with twenty loaves. Jesus surpasses this by feeding five thousand with only five loaves and two fish. Jesus was able to provide a wonderful feast for thousands of people. All had plenty to eat and what was left over filled twelve wicker baskets. Through this miracle John prepares us for a month of Sundays (a continuous reading of this 6th chapter) on which Jesus will reveal himself to be the *Bread of Life* and teach us about his gift of the Eucharist. In this year of Eucharistic Revival for our Country (having just celebrated the National Eucharistic Congress) we, like the people of Jesus' time realize at every Mass we witness a miracle, a sign to bring us to Faith. St. Paul lists for us the qualities expected of disciples who want to be worthy to share the Bread of Life. Our psalm response reminds us: "The hand of the Lord feeds us; he answers all our needs".



ames, his brother John (the sons of Zebedee) and Peter were special favorites of the Lord. They had the privilege of witnessing the Transfiguration. James was called "the Greater" because he was older than the other Apostle named James. The two of them are the ones who told the Lord that they thought they deserved a special place in his kingdom. They bragged that they would be able to sacrifice their lives, as Jesus was going to sacrifice his. Jesus took the brothers aside. He told them that they did not understand what true service to others meant. He said that anyone who wanted to be truly great had to be the servant of others. Jesus was what trving teach them he expected Jesus called the two brothers "sons of thunder" because they sometimes lost their tempers. One time the people of a village turned them away. James and John were upset that the villagers would not welcome Jesus.

They asked the Lord if he wanted them to call down fire to destroy the village. Jesus had to correct them and remind them that God wants us to act with love. But James and John did learn from everything Jesus taught. They became great examples of faith for all of Jesus' followers. After Pentecost, James stayed in Jerusalem to preach about Jesus even though it was dangerous to be known as a Christian. He was soon arrested and put to death. James was the first Apostle to become a martyr for his faith in Christ. James' life reminds us that, if we ask him, Jesus will help us to change our bad habits and grow in living as his disciples.


