PASTOR'S CORNER

Reflection on the Liturgy of the Word



First Reading *Isaiah 50:5-9a* The suffering servant of Yahweh is assured of God's help

Responsorial Psalm *Psalm 116:1-2,3-4,5-6,8-9* A prayer of praise to God for his salvation

Second Reading James 2:14-18 James teaches that faith must be demonstrated in one's works

Gospel Reading Mark 8:27-35

Peter declares that Jesus is the Christ, and Jesus teaches that those who would follow him must take up his or her cross

The Gospel for today has Jesus teaching us about the nature of Christian discipleship. Asking us a question that involves a response based on faith, prayer and the study of our religion: "But who do you say that I am?" Like Peter we respond: "You are the Christ." Jesus teaches that he will be the kind of Messiah Isaiah describes in our first reading, God's servant who willingly suffers to save God's people. Only by taking up our cross and following Jesus in self-sacrificing love can we share his resurrection. As James challenges us to be Agents of the New Evangelization by living the Gospel in practical works of charity and justice: "So also faith of itself; if it does not have works, is dead." Let us open our ears to hear God's Word that following the teaching of Jesus we may live as his disciples.



CATECHETICAL SUNDAY SEPTEMBER 15TH 11:00 MASS

Each year, the Catholic Church in the United States designates the third Sunday in September as "Catechetical Sunday"—a day on which to celebrate and pray for the Church's mission to teach the Gospel to all people. A catechist responds to a call to share the gift of faith with others, even as you deepen your own faith. This call ultimately comes from God, whose Holy Spirit inspires and guides you.

THEME FOR THIS YEAR: "Lord, when did we see you hungry" Matthew 25:37 "Señor, ¿cuándo te vimos hambriento?" Mateo 25:37

Our theme reflects our call to missionary discipleship. As St John Paul II reminded us: The universal call to holiness is closely linked to the universal call to mission. Every member of the

faithful is called to holiness and to mission. We are called to be Eucharist by word and action to our brothers and sisters in Christ. Our times cry out for this kind of holiness, one inflamed by the ardent determination to bring as many of our brothers and sisters as possible to Christ.



The word catechesis is from a Greek word meaning "to echo." All those who teach the Catholic faith and share the Church's teachings, by word and by the way they live their lives, are catechists. The catechist's goal is always to set hearts aflame for Christ. We celebrate and pray for all who come forward for this ministry. They are people who are willing to share their own faith and have the courage to listen to the faith stories of others, without judgment but with a sense of wonder and awe.

In May 2021, Pope Francis established the lay ministry of catechist in the Catholic Church, officially declaring that catechists are to be recognized as lay ministers in the Catholic Church and are due the training and support they need to be successful in their ministry.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church states that parents have the mission of teaching their children to pray and to discover their vocation as children of God. (CCC 2226) Therefore, moms, dads, stepparents, grandparents, foster parents, godparents, and all who form the faith of children at home, in the domestic church, are the first and most important catechists of their children.

Today the Church remembers the Sorrows of Mary. There is no liturgical celebration because we celebrate the Sunday Ordinary Time Mass.

We have many titles for Mary, the mother of Jesus. There is no shortage of devotions to the various virtues of this Blessed Virgin. There are so many ways in which we can look to and learn from Mary. The title "Our Lady of Sorrows" focuses specifically on the sorrows that Mary chose to endure as the mother of Jesus. In the earlier years of the Church, this Feast Day was on the Friday after Palm Sunday. It was originally added to the Roman Missal under the title "Our Lady of Compassion" and was intended to emphasize the great love and compassion that Mary had for her beloved Son, which allowed her to willingly endure such sorrow. By 1668, the devotion developed specifically into honoring the "Seven Dolors" or the "Seven Sorrows" of Mary, In the 1900's Pope Pius X established the permanent date as September 15th

We remember the 7 Sorrows of Mary: the Flight into Egypt, the Presentation of Jesus in the Temple, Jesus being lost in Jerusalem, the meeting of Mary and Jesus on the way to Calvary, the Crucifixion, the taking down of Jesus' body from the Cross and Jesus' Burial

PREVIEW OF THE READINGS:

Each of the readings show the terrible consequences of self-centeredness. Confronted by a just person, the selfish lawbreakers in the first reading plan to torture and kill him. James warns his readers that jealousy and selfishness bring conflict and even war. Jesus contrasts the contentiousness of the disciples, who were arguing about which of them were the greatest, with the innocence of a child, who does not know ambition. Let us note the self-centered tendencies in our own character and look for the antidote in these readings
