



.First Reading *Deuteronomy 6:2-6*

Moses teaches the people to love and worship God alone.

Responsorial Psalm Psalm 18:2-3,3-4,47,51

A prayer of praise to God our strength

Second Reading *Hebrews 7:23-28*

Jesus intercedes for us as our eternal high priest.

Gospel Reading Mark 12:28b-34

Jesus is questioned by a scribe about the greatest commandment.

The words of today's first reading from Deuteronomy form the prayer recited several times daily by devout Jewish believers. It is at once a prayer and doctrinal summary of the faith: Shema, Israel, "Hear, O Israel! The Lord is our God, the Lord alone! Therefore, you shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength."

Jesus knew these words and recited them often as in the Gospel he declares them to be the first commandment. But then Jesus adds to them another command from Leviticus: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself". Now the love of God and love of neighbor become the rule of life for Jesus' disciples in every generation.

In this month of All Saints and All Souls, the second reading from Hebrews pictures Jesus as our High Priest forever interceding for us in the Kingdom of Heaven

National Vocation Awareness Week celebrated in our country November 3-9. Please ask Our Lord for more dedicated, holy priests, deacons, and consecrated men and women. May they be inspired by Jesus Christ, supported by our faith community, and respond generously to God's gift of vocation



An annual week-long celebration of the Catholic Church in the United States dedicated to promote vocations to the priesthood, diaconate and consecrated life through prayer and education, and to renew our prayers and support for those who are considering one of these particular vocations. NVAW began in 1976 when the U.S. Bishops designated the 28th Sunday of the year for NVAW. In 1997, this celebration was moved to coincide with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. Beginning in 2014, NVAW was moved to the first full week of November.

Pope Francis, speaking on vocations, emphasized that it is at the loving initiative of God, and by His personal encounter with each of us, that one is called. "Even amid these troubled times, the mystery of the Incarnation reminds us that God continually comes to encounter us. He is God-with-us, who walks along the often dusty paths of our lives. He knows our anxious longing for love and he calls us to joy. In the diversity and the uniqueness of each and every vocation, personal and ecclesial, there is a need to listen, discern and live this word that calls to us from on high and, while enabling us to develop our talents, makes us instruments of salvation in the world and guides us to full happiness."

A NEW ADDITION TO OUR CHURCH IS THE REAL CANDLE STAND IN FRONT OF ST. JOSEPH DONATED IN MEMORY OF A FORMER PARISHIONER JOSEPH A, CURCIO BY HIS WIFE ANNE AND FAMILY



The use of candles in churches is a long-standing tradition dating back centuries. Real candles have been a staple in church services, symbolizing light and faith.. The spiritual significance of lighting a real candle allows for a physical connection to our prayers and intentions. To meet this need for wax candle votive stands the St Killian's Candle Company has developed the perfect solution.

How It Works: The St Killian's votive system consists of three glass pieces. The colored glass is attached to the stand, with the middle glass acting as a barrier to protect the color from any excess wax. The outer glass candle holder is red. The candle is placed inside the inner glass, where the flame is securely contained. Each candle burns for 60-90 minutes, then becomes completely liquid and falls through a hole at the bottom of the inner glass. The flame goes out as it falls into a water bath to ensure it is completely extinguished. The offering intention for each candle is \$2.00
